KINFRA PLAYS PROACTIVE ROLE TO TIDE OVER FLOOD CALAMITIES

he recent floods and landslides that hit Kerala have adversely affected the KINFRA Parks also, especially in the northern parts of the State. The most affected are KINFRA Small Industries Park in Wayanad, KINFRA Techno Industrial Park at Kakkancherry and KINFRA Park in Palakkad. KINFRA Parks authorities across the State have taken commendable effort, along with entrepreneurs, to recover from the calamity and also extend a helping hand to those affected at various places.

"KINFRA staff attached to various units offered their two days' salary to the CM's Distress Relief Fund. They were also at the forefront in collecting essential items like food, clothes, medicines, drinking water and napkins and making arrangements to supply these materials to various relief camps in the State," said Wg. Cdr. K A Santhosh Kumar, Managing Director, KINFRA.

In Thiruvananthapuram, officials from KINFRA Film & Video Park and KINFRA International Apparel Park sent around 16 truckloads of materials to relief camps across Kerala. The KINFRA unit at



Palakkad set up a relief camp on its premises which accommodated about 850 people. They also co-ordinated air dropping of food grains and essential goods with the help of eight IAF helicopters. KINRA also allowed the opening of a temporary route through the KINFRA land at Hi-Tech Park, Kalamasserry for the movement of ambulances and heavy vehicles carrying refugees to the



relief camps.

KINFRA Techno Industrial Park, Kakkancherry arranged 25 barrels of treated drinking water and food kits for distribution in affected areas, and for the local fishermen of Kadalundi.

KINFRA Textile Centre, Kannur co-ordinated the collection and distribution of three truckloads of food items and clothes for the affected people in a tribal colony at Padinjarathara. In addition, KIN-FRA organised the purification of water for drinking (reverse osmosis system) at Thrissur.

The officials of Kinesco Power Utilities Limited, a subsidiary unit of KINFRA operating in Ernakulam, co-ordinated with KSEB in restoring power supply to the affected areas in association with Kerala State Electricity Board (KSEB).
