The new startup entity under KINFRA offers quality assurance and contractual research services to industries, public, researchers and students.

The research expertise of the lab is poised to extend an extensive range of proficient services in quality assessment, analytical testing, genomics, bioinformatics and microbiology. The lab also boasts of a strong Research and Development wing to provide holistic solutions to clients.

ity assessment services, supporting researchers and students with right guidance and training by simplifying the process profitably," says Akhilesh V P, the Managing Partner of Amplicon BioLabs.

The main services offered at this startup laboratory are water quality assessment and analysis, sensory, physical, chemical and microbiological analysis of water, food product testing services for industries, soil testing, and nutrients and pH sample testing for agriculture purpose.

The lab will provide a platform for researchers and other institutions which require the facility and equipment. "Here, we conduct analyses of samples. Normally, in such cases, clients may not have required apparatuses and equipment to hold tests. That's why we call it contractual research services," he adds.

Amplicon BioLabs also offers skill development and training programmes for researchers, students and academicians in various disciplines of life sciences.

Courses offered for research students have been authored and tweaked by learning specialists and are curated by experts. Bespoke training systems and modules, according to Akhilesh, are the best in the industry.
